

Any unforeseen delays caused by the customer will be billed.

(2) For electrical connections and disconnections of 400 amps or more, two electricians are required.

(3) The fender rental price indicated is for a maximum of 4 fenders of 4 meters for a period of 7 days. If more than 4 fenders are required, or if rental is required for more than 7 days, the rate applies again. Rate does not include displacement.






