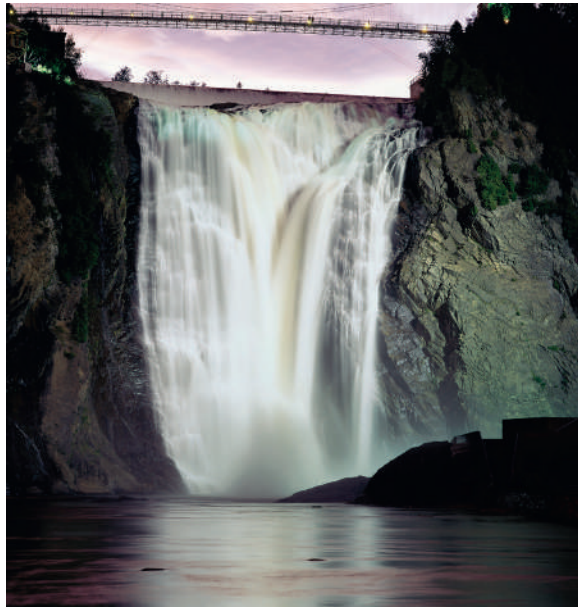

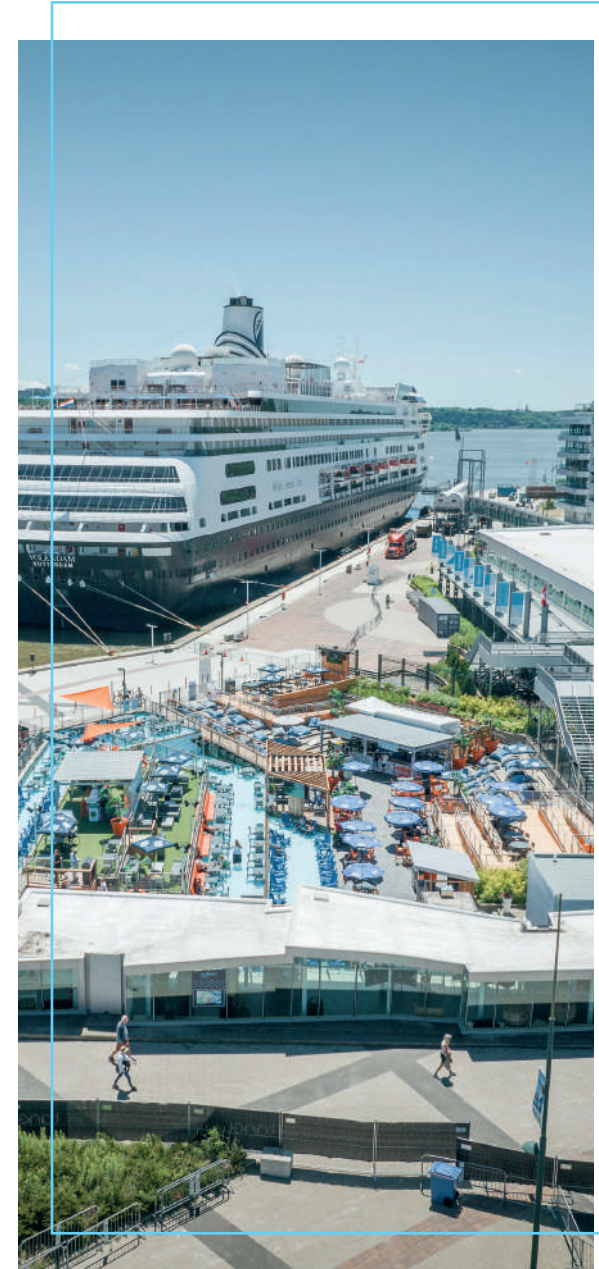
CRUISE TERMINAL 30

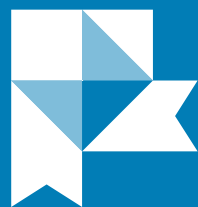
